



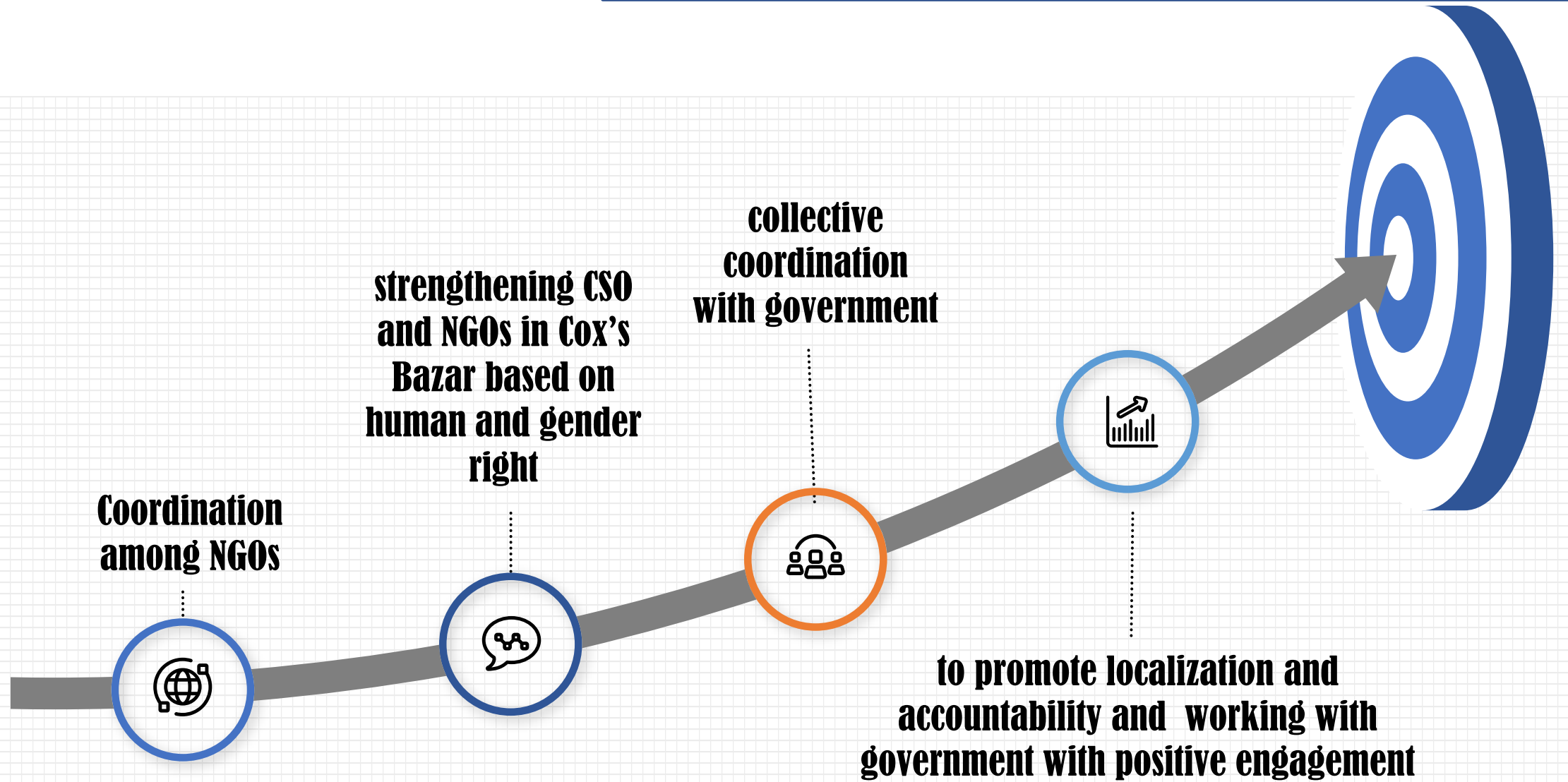

Public Dialogue

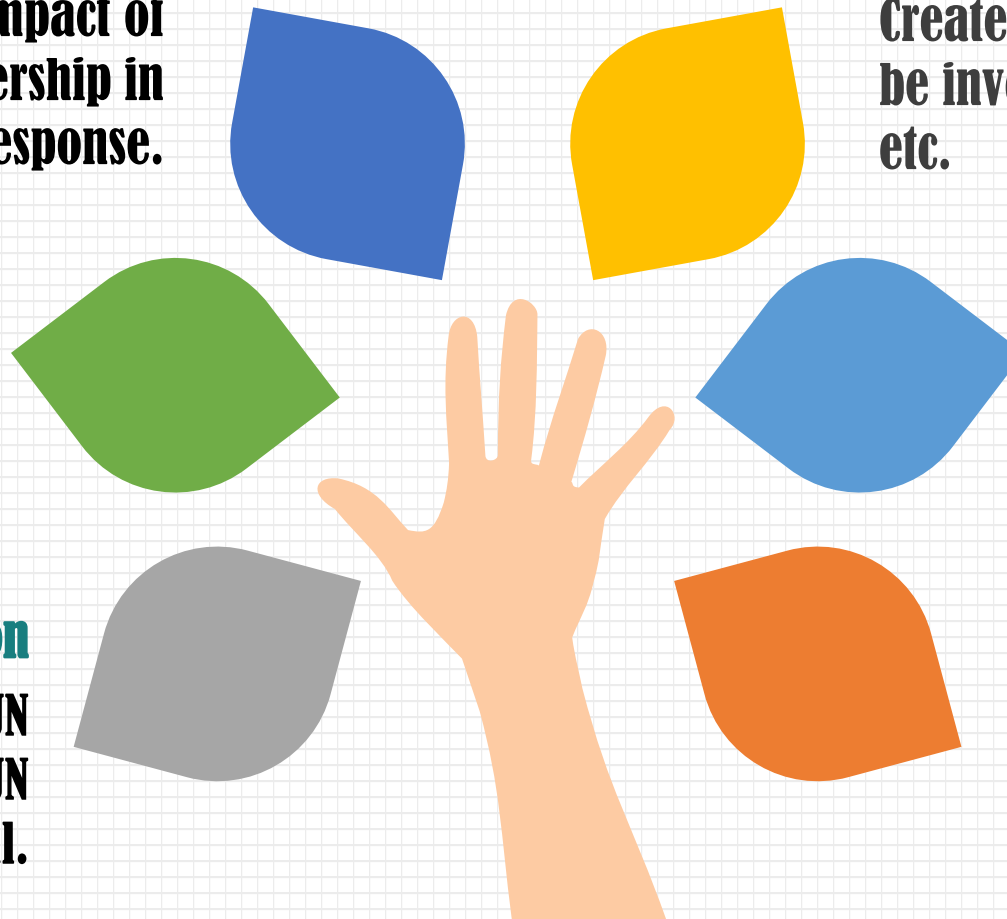
Created spaces for all stakeholders to be involved in assessment, opinion etc.

Publications to promote human rights, awareness and as references of advocacy issues.



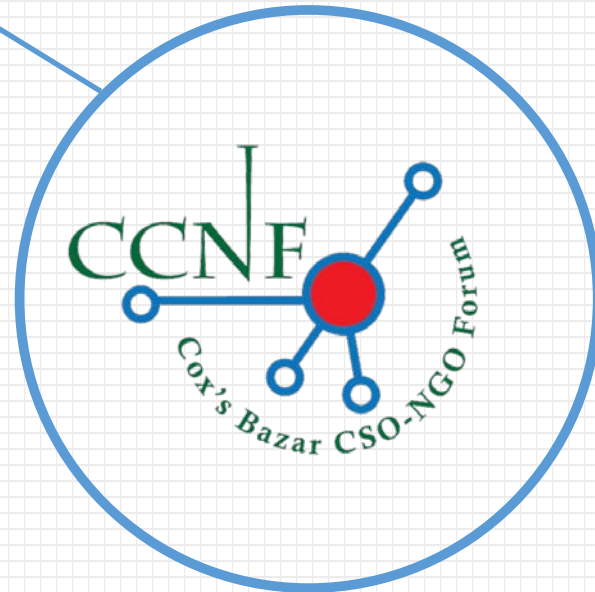
If CCNF was not there!
