- There is not enough money that arrives in the right place, in the right way, and at the right time.
- As we engage among Grand Bargain signatories on the future, clear milestones, commitments, and accountability measures are critical.
- We as NGOs also need to do our part to ensure that we work appropriately with our own local partners, passing through quality funding, covering the real costs of humanitarian operations, and sharing humanitarian finance data.
- We need to work closer with development, peace, climate, and other actors to help ensure that these systems are working to minimize the number of people that require humanitarian assistance. It is about roles and responsibilities.
- It is important that we reach out to both traditional and non-traditional funders to explore ways to better fund humanitarians directly and to reduce burdens on humanitarian systems.

- Priority to the L/N NGOs and make a networking umbrella, local CSO, CBO could be capacitated and involve response
- NGO community need to identify ways in which we can influence donors and other stakeholders to fund in ways that reduce burdens on the system.
