Background	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. FDMN Relief and Future Response. Since August 2017 and so far even after having the arrangement agreement with Myanmar and Government of Bangladesh, FDMN is entering in the Coxsbazar district of Bangladesh still, and all together it reached around 1 million. In the beginning of influx, it is the government, local community and local organization has responded with relief, in course of time UN and INGOs engaged rigorously. It was blanket operation in the beginning to save the life, but as influx reduced in numbers gradually, our government trying to hold the situation, there are systems of coordination and control has almost established. Now with the leadership of UN (United Nation), a joint response plan (JRP) is being prepared for the period of April to December 2018. Some of the stakeholder already raised the issue on integration of the Grand Bargain (GP) principles in this JRP and to make the document live, so that in course of time there will be integration and improvement in this regard. 2. Bangladeshi NGOs Mobilization on Localization. Bangladeshi NGOs have been pro-actively participating in WHS (World Humanitarian Summit) during 2013 to 2016, they have also follow up campaign and discussion in Bangladesh during 2017, and they have developed a Charter of Expectation (CE) in this regard (http://coastbd.net/our-common-space-our-complementary-roles-equitable-partnership-for-sovereign-and-accountable-civil-society-growth/). With this influence and background NGOs in Coxsbazar who are working FDMN relief response they have formed an alliance “ Coxsbazar CSO NGO Forum – CCNF (www.cxb-cso-ngo.org) , they have demanded the localization (http://www.cxb-cso-ngo.org/2017/10/05/coxs-bazar-local-ngos-and-csos-demand-to-chief-of-ocha-under-secretary-general-mr-mark-un-agencies-must-abandon-direct-operation-single-handle-and-monopolistic-approach-too/) and made application to Mr Mark Lowcock , UN Under Secretary General on 3rd October 2017 in Coxsbazar. The meeting was facilitated by Asia Representative ICVA (International Council of Voluntary Association) and OCHA high officials from Bangkok. As a Bangladeshi NGO COAST (www.coastbd.net) was actively involved in this process since the beginning, who are also member of CHS Alliance (www.chsalliance.org) and ICVA (www.icvanetwork.org) and Asian Disaster Risk Reduction Network - ADRRN (www.adrrrn.net) too. Oxfam and Start Fund were supporting the initiatives. Now COAST is representing national and local NGOs in both SEG (Strategic Executive Group) led by UN RC (United Nation Resident Coordinator) and HCTT (Humanitarian Coordination Task Team) led by Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR) and facilitated by Humanitarian Advisor and Specialist of UN RC office. 3. Recent Study and Toward the Integration of the GB Principles. During January and

	<p>February there was a study done by Smruti Patel of GMI and Koenraad Van Brabant of Navigation 360 did a study in this regard on FDMN response, a part of the study has also assisted by COAST. Preliminary finding of the study have been presented for discussion and validation in Dhaka on 11th February (http://www.cxb-cso-ngo.org/2018/02/13/research-findings-on-humanitarian-response-to-rohingya-crisis-choice-between-titanic-and-life-boat-regrading-localisation/). Including COAST and several others participants of the meeting realized that the findings should be widely disseminate to all related stakeholders and also to start up the discussion on how to integrate the GB principles in FDMN relief, i.e., the way toward, especially reducing the transaction cost, ensuring local level accountability and participation, best use local knowledge and resources in upholding role of local responders / humanitarian actors, especially of local NGOs.</p> <p>4. Multi stakeholder consultation and its primary outline: Taking this in background as ICVA and OCHA Asia representatives will be visiting in Coxsbazar and Dhaka during the period of Feb.27 to March 3rd, COAST and ICVA has primarily agreed to organize two multi stakeholder consultations in this regard with the active support of other interested parties, so that the process will be inclusive and with wider ownership.
